Dear Chairman Graham, Senator Leahy, Chairwoman Lowey and Representative Rogers,

Thank you for your longstanding leadership in the battle against infectious diseases at home and around the world. As clinicians, scientists and public health practitioners we have seen firsthand how crucially important, and successful, U.S. global health investments have been in tackling devastating global diseases and protecting America's health security.

As you prepare your Fiscal Year 2020 State, Foreign Operations Appropriations bills, we encourage you to provide increased funding for the U.S. contribution to the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria (Global Fund).

As you know, the Global Fund is the largest multilateral financier of global health programming in the world and has long enjoyed strong bipartisan Congressional support because of its results-oriented, transparent and accountable approach. Since 2002, Global Fund-supported programs have saved over 27 million lives and driven significant decreases in death rates from AIDS, TB and malaria. In countries where the Global Fund invests, the number of deaths caused by AIDS, TB and malaria each year has been reduced by one-third.

In October 2019, France will host the 6th Replenishment for the Global Fund. The Global Fund Investment Case illustrates how new investments can accelerate progress toward ending the epidemics of AIDS, TB and malaria. Based on the continued urgent need and its strategic investment plan, the Global Fund is seeking a minimum of \$14 billion from all donors for the three-year replenishment cycle beginning in 2020.

The U.S. has traditionally provided one third of Global Fund financing, leveraging other donors in support of the organization. Based on the overall Replenishment target, and with the goal of driving strong pledges from donors globally, **we urge you to consider a \$1.56 billion appropriation to the Global Fund for FY 2020.** This funding level is consistent with a three-year U.S. commitment of \$4.8 billion, 12 percent above the three-year, \$4.3 billion pledge the

U.S. made for the previous Replenishment cycle in 2016. The Global Fund and U.S. bilateral global health programs, including the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief, the President's Malaria Initiative, and the USAID tuberculosis program, are increasingly inter-reliant and depend on each other for success, coordinating closely in the field and on national-level planning.

We are particularly concerned with the expanding global challenge of antimicrobial drug resistance. Deaths from drug-resistant TB account for a third of all antimicrobial resistance deaths in the world. In Southeast Asia, the spread of resistance to the most commonly used drug against malaria (artemisinin) threatens to undo hard-fought progress against the disease. Global Fund-supported programming helps fight drug resistance by scaling up prevention activities, optimized treatment, health professionals training, and supply line and data improvements. Stronger systems are then better able to detect and treat antimicrobial resistance, as well as identify and address emerging infectious diseases before they cross borders and become severe epidemics.

We greatly appreciate your ongoing support for America's leading role in fighting AIDS, TB and malaria. Now is time to invest in ending these terrible epidemics for good.
